

IQAC Summary Report 2021-22

The annual IQAC report serves as a valuable tool for an educational institution to evaluate its performance, identify areas for improvement, and demonstrate its commitment to quality assurance and quality enhancement.

Criteria 1: The course programs have undergone revisions according to the feedback suggestions and foreseeing the trends of the market. The institution has focused on incorporating the essence of entrepreneurship and employability

Criteria 2: The institution has received 58% student enrolment for the academic year with a student strength of nearly 2055 students. The Unit Tests are organized to assess the learning progress of students at regular intervals. The institution has been capable of identifying the weak and necessary remedial programs were organized for them. The internal assessment exam is organized at the end of the session before the final exam. It helps to give credit in the final assessment and reduces the burden and tension related to the final examination. In the post-pandemic period, the institution has witnessed an increase in experiential learning methodologies. The faculty are well qualified with promising profiles and the number of faculty with PhD has improved. They keep their daily mirrors and teaching plans under the academic schedules of the college calendar and bounce back to normal routines. The institution's online services, and e-governance, were functioning well and a regular student satisfaction survey was conducted with positive results.

Criteria 3: The institution strongly emphasises research and has implemented policies and programs to support this focus. The Research Committee acts as a support system for scholars and faculty, by organizing seminars, workshops and other programs to promote research. The institution conducted a workshop on Research Methodology and I P R. Faculties have been actively engaged in research initiatives. There has been an increase in 03 number of research guides in the research centre of Commerce to support student research and 11 research scholars were registered. Faculties are published research papers in various national and international journals and Book chapters in edited books. In addition to the focus on research, the institution also places importance on extension activities such as the NSS camp, the COVID vaccination program on 16th February 2022, the Red Ribbon club program, Social work such as Swach Bharat Mission on 24th October 2021, World Aids Day, Womens

Day, Deaddiction Campaign on Gandhi Jayanti street play on Women empowerment and Deaddiction on 20th November 2021 and collaboration with other reputed institutions. Seven fictional MoU s signed with other institutions.

Criteria 4: It was a considerably good year for the infrastructural development of the college with the tremendous increase in its physical facilities. Almost every department of the college has incorporated new facilities and updated its modes of working. One of the primary physical changes occurred in the library with more e-books and e-resources being added. The institution has subscribed N list every year it provides e-learning resources such as e-books, e-journals and Shodh Sindhu. Collage has 120 computers and various ICT tools such as smartboards, projectors and a free Wi-Fi campus for ICT-based teaching and learning.

Criteria 5: The students have immensely benefitted from the institutional support in the form of scholarships and free ships based on merit or for those who have lost their parents due to COVID-19. The management has also focused on improving the sports facilities for the students. The SC/ST/OBC and Minority cell is functioning correctly with regular monitoring of the welfare activities of the group. The records of these associations are maintained properly. The college has been able to mark its identity in sports and cultural events through its organization and participation in local, state and national events. In student participation and activities, the college has worked efficiently to incorporate a good share of student participation in its activities through the active functioning of the student council on the campus for organizing and conducting cultural activities. The college placement cell is functioning actively in the college with a greater number of students being trained in personality development through mock interviews and interactions with experts from the first year onwards and the results of these initiatives are yet to be finalised in the upcoming hopeful years. The alumni association has also played an important role.

Criteria 6: The decentralization activities of the college are progressing well. The students, student representatives from each class and faculty form the composition of the departmental council. This decentralization action gives them a fair chance to provide their valuable feedback, especially towards the curriculum-based aspects. The e-governance initiative is expanding its reach to different areas of operations in the college and is successful in bringing about positive changes in all aspects of operations like admissions and examinations. The number of faculty receiving funding support from the management for attending FDPs orientation, refresher, seminar, workshop. and other improvement courses have increased yet

can venture into schemes that sponsor funds for the same. The number of online FDPs being attended by the faculty has also increased during this year. The decentralized working of the IQAC committee is commendable and is progressing with NAAC preparatory activities with timely submission of data for the ranking procedures.

Criteria 7: Gender sensitization activities are being carried out without fail in the institution. the college actively organises events and programs that sensitise the public as well as the students to gender-related issues and legal support. To ensure that the institution operates effectively and efficiently, a code of conduct has been established for all members of the community, including students, faculty, and staff. the college's NSS (National Service Scheme) and NCC (National Cadet Corps) departments are active and have organized a variety of programs aimed at promoting social and civic values within the campus community. These programs serve as a means of reinforcing a positive and productive learning environment. Concerning the environmental initiatives of the college, there has been solar energy production on the campus. Plantation programmes were organised. The e-waste management techniques have been refined in a more organisational pattern. The rainwater harvesting system is well established and produces the expected outcomes. The college has elaborated its parking area foreseeing future traffic congestion. In view of this the following plan is proposed for the next academic session.

2. Plan to reconstruct toilet and washrooms of the college premises.
3. Prepare the schedule of seminar, workshop and FDP related programs.

5. To make students well equipped with the latest development on the field of study through invited lectures and workshops.
6. Enhance the relationship between teachers and students to solve their academic doubts with groups.
7. Plan to upload arrangement of project work on the website and make a provision of online Submission of all the same.
8. To organize special camp on yoga.
9. To propagate stronger interaction with alumni.
10. To organize health checks up camp and vaccination for students.


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
